You can use your pass between 2pm and 3pm.



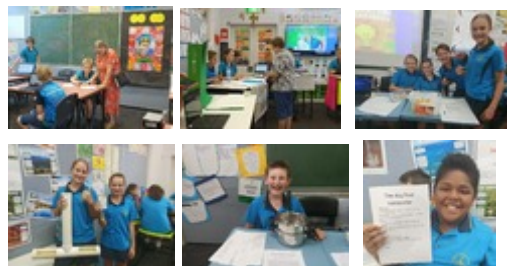
